## Working Hunter Ring

### Ridden classes

**Please note that riders entering the under 12s classes are not eligible for classes 1 - 15.**

1. **Best turned-out horse/pony and rider**
2. **Novice ridden horse/pony or rider** (Snaffles only. Please enter in the spirit intended. A Novice pony is one who is newly backed, inexperienced or changing to a ridden career. Novice riders are those in their first year of competition)
3. **Ridden mountain and moorland**
4. **Ridden cob** (traditional or hogged)
5. **Ridden coloured** (Piebald, skewbald, palomino, dun or appaloosa)
6. **Ridden hunter/ sports horse or pony**
7. **Ridden show pony/hack/riding horse**
8. **Open equitation** (judged on rider ability)
9. **Ridden veteran** (to exceed 15 years of age)
10. **Best riding club type** (to include a small jump)

### Working Hunter Classes

#### Start time not before 12.00 (to follow class 10)

Working hunter classes will be judged on jumping performance (50 marks), style and presence while jumping (20 marks), conformation, type and freedom of action (20 marks), manners/show (10 marks).

11. **Beginners working hunter** – Maximum height 40cm (. Please enter in the spirit intended. Entrants in this class are only able to enter jumping classes of 50cm or less)
12. **Novice working hunter** – Maximum height 60cm (Please enter in the spirit intended. A Novice pony is one who is newly backed, inexperienced or changing to a jumping career. Novice riders are those in their first year of jumping competition)
13. **Intermediate working hunter** – Approximate height 70cm
14. **Small open working hunter** – Approximate height 80cm
15. **Open working hunter** – Approximate height 90cm

## Showing Ring

### In Hand Classes

#### Start Time 9:00

16. **In hand best turned-out horse/pony and leader**
17. **In hand youngstock** (3 years and under)
18. **Best in hand pony** (Not exceeding 14.2hh)
19. **Best in hand horse** (Exceeding 14.2hh)
20. **In hand mountain and moorland**
21. **In hand cob** (traditional or hogged)
22. **In hand coloured** (Piebald, skewbald, palomino, dun or appaloosa)
23. **In hand veteran** (to exceed 15 years of age)
24. **Young handler** (handler under 12 years of age)

## Under 12 Classes

### Start time not before 12.00 (to follow class 24)

**All classes are open to lead rein and first ridden riders.**

**Lead rein** - riders not to have attained their 9<sup>th</sup> birthday as of 01.01.2022. **First ridden** – riders not to have attained their 12<sup>th</sup> birthday as of 01.01.2022. All lead reins must wear a snaffle, with the lead rein attached to the noseband. All first ridden ponies must wear a snaffle. No upper height limit for ponies. Balance reins **ARE** permitted for FR ponies and riders.

25. **Ridden Best turned-out** (pony, rider and leader)
26. **Ridden Equitation** (Judged on rider ability)
27. **Ridden have a go off the lead** (assistance may be given)
28. **Best riding club type** (to include a small jump or trotting poles)
29. **Cradle stakes working hunter** (maximum height 30cm with a maximum of 5 jumps - assistance may be given)

## Main Ring

### Show jumping

#### Start Time 10.00

Horses and ponies will jump together over a single-phase course but will be placed separately. Pony not exceeding 14.2hh. Horses exceeding 14.2hh. No horse or pony to enter more than 3 show jumping classes.

30. **Beginner show jumping** – Maximum height 50cm (strictly beginners must not enter any other SJ class) a) Pony b) Horse
31. **Novice show jumping** – Maximum height 60cm a) Pony b) Horse
32. **Intermediate show jumping** – Maximum height 70cm a) Pony b) Horse
33. **Small open show jumping** – Maximum height 80cm a) Pony b) Horse
34. **Open show jumping** – Maximum height a) Pony b) Horse
35. **Grand prix show jumping** – Maximum height 1m a) Pony b) Horse

### Tickhill Riding Club Rules

- All entries are made on the basis that all individuals have read and will comply the club rules
- A valid passport and vaccination record must accompany the horse/pony to all events and be available for inspection
- Horses must be vaccinated in accordance with BRC rules.
- For all TRC events, all ages are as of the 01 January in the current year
- Any rider must be over the age of 4 years
- All ridden horses must be age 4 or over
- Entry fees only refundable prior to the withdrawal date (Wednesday prior to the show)
- All dogs must be always kept on a lead
- Excessive use of whips or spurs will result in the rider having a discussion with the committee and using the opportunity to educate the individual on correct horsemanship
- No Whips are not to exceed 75cm (30ins)
- Hats must be worn with harnesses properly adjusted and fastened: They **MUST** adhere to [BRC standards](#)
- Skull cap hats must be worn with a silk
- Body protectors encouraged for show jumping and working hunter classes
- The correct attire must be worn for all competitions (SJ – jacket, SJ shirt or shirt and tie, light coloured jodhpurs, long or jodhpur boots. ODC – As per XC. For more information on the correct showing attire, please see the TRC website.)
- During periods of extreme weather, the committee will announce temporary rulings relating to the wearing of jackets and/or coats
- Any complaint must be lodged at the secretary's cabin with the payment of £10, which will be refunded should the objection not be sustained
- The decision of the judges or committee is FINAL

- The committee reserve the right to refuse entry, amalgamate or cancel any class at their discretion  
We may in our absolute discretion refuse to accept any entry, the entry will be returned along with any fee and no correspondence will be entered into with regard to the non-acceptance
- We reserve the right in our absolute discretion to change the identity of the judge for any classes from the one previously announced
- Spectators are reminded that Horse and Ponies can be unpredictable and to take care of themselves and their children at all times. People behaving inappropriately will be advised, and if not taken notice of, will be asked to leave the venue. If you have “non horsey” persons attending the show to watch you, please ensure they are aware of potential hazards
- Foals are not permitted to attend the show
- Stallions and colts are not permitted to enter the show
- Any competitor not ready when called may be eliminated
- Lunging is not allowed on the show field
- All horses or ponies attending the club field must have adequate insurance cover (at least third party)
- Save for death or personal injury caused by negligence of the organisers or anyone whom they are in law responsible, neither TRC or BHS nor any agent, employee, or representative of these bodies will accept any liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, spectators, land or any other person or property whatsoever, whether caused by negligence, breach of contract or in any other way whatsoever.
