## IN HAND

*All handlers to be 8 years or over as of 1<sup>st</sup> March 2022. Handlers under 8 years must be accompanied by an adult (over 18 yrs old).*

### **Class 1 : Winter Woolies Condition and Turn Out**

Open to all horses and ponies judged on 50% horse and 50% handler (may be split into two groups stabled and field kept)

### **Class 2 : Non British Breeds**

Open to all Non British Breeds including Fjords, Arabs, Hafflingers, Warmbloods, Irish Draught, Connemara etc.

### **Class 3 : Coloured**

Open to all Skewbald, Piebald, Spotted, Roan, Dun and Palomino

### **Class 4 : Solid Colour**

Open to all Bay, Grey, Black or Chestnut horse or pony

### **Class 5 : Small British Native Breeds**

Open to all Registered and Unregistered British Breeds (Shetland, Dartmoor, Exmoor, Welsh A & B)

### **Class 6 : Large British Native Breeds**

Open to all Registered and Unregistered British Breeds (Dales, Fell, Highland, New Forest, Welsh C & D, Suffolk Punch, Shire, Clydesdale, Thoroughbred etc).

### **Class 7 : Veteran**

Open to horses and ponies over the age of 15

**Please note : All handlers must be correctly turned out.**



# **RULES & CONDITIONS OF ENTRY**

- It shall be deemed a condition of entry that Mortimer Riding Club, persons acting on their behalf, or their agents, or the landowners shall not be held responsible for any loss, injury, accident, damage or illness to horses, owners, riders, spectators or any other person whatsoever whether caused by their negligence, breach of contract or in any way whatsoever. The Committee recommend that all riders have adequate Personal, Third Party and Horse Insurance
- Everyone mounted - whether a competitor or not - MUST wear protective headgear that includes a permanently fitted, non-detachable retaining harness secured to the shell at more than two points. Such headgear must be worn with the harness properly adjusted and fastened at all times. A riding hat complying with BS6473 or a skull cap BS4472 is the compulsory minimum required, however British Riding Clubs recommend that the PAS015 standard or equivalent be worn
- The Organisers reserve the right to alter or cancel the event or any of the published information
- In the event of an objection the Secretary's decision is final
- No refund of entry fees will be made except on receipt of a Doctor's or Veterinary Surgeon's certificate
- No horse or pony under 4yo may be ridden at the event
- No stallions or dogs
- No cantering
- No skipping out
- First Aid is 999 call only, so people attend at their own risk
- The Secretary may require to see Horse Passports, so please have them available on the day
- Please take care in the parking area and follow instructions if given. Leave the area tidy when you leave and clear of horse droppings
- All Children - mounted or not - are the responsibility of their Parent/Guardian at all times
- Handlers must be 8yo or over, handlers under 8 yo must be accompanied in the ring by an adult (18yo or over)
