PLEASE READ AND ABIDE BY ALL THE RULES

PLEASE COLLECT PRINTED NUMBERS FROM SECRETARY AND DISPLAY IN NUMBER BIBS

In the event of wet ground, Dressage and Show Jumping will be held on surface at the Equestrian Centre.

CLEAR ROUNDS:

We will be running clear rounds over the short – up to 60cm - (£15) and long cross-country courses (£20) - 70-90cm. Show Jumping Clear Rounds are available for £10. All clear rounds to run at the same time as the competitive classes of the corresponding height. Please enter on the day in cash. £5 First Aid in addition to Clear Round if not already paid as a competitor.

ONE DAY EVENT

Dressage Tests can be called in all classes

CLASS 1: Mini (20-30cm)May be on the Lead Rein/Assisted or UnassistedDressage Test: Pony Club Walk & Trot Test (2022) - Whips allowed. Any 'normal' bit (please see below) and
grass reins allowed. No back poles in show jumping course. Shorted XC course, fences approx. 20 – 30cm.

CLASS 2: Intro (Approx. 40cm)Assistance Allowed but not suitable for Lead ReinDressage Test: Intro A (2008) - Whips allowed. Any 'normal' bit (please see below) and grass reins allowed.Water Optional.

The Water is included in classes 3-7, can be missed but will receive 10 penalty points.

CLASS 3: Novice (Approx. 50cm)No assistance other than calling the testDressage Test: Prelim C (2016)- Whips allowed. Any 'normal' bit (please see below) and grass reins allowedfor Dressage only.

CLASS 4: Novice Plus (Approx. 60cm)No assistance other than calling the testDressage test: Prelim 12 (2016) - Whips allowed. Any 'normal' bit (please see below). No grass reinsallowed. Please note Prelim 12 is the same pattern as 2024 Prelim 2.

CLASS 5: Intermediate (Approx. 70cm)No assistance other than calling the testDressage test: Prelim 3 (2024) – Whips allowed. BRC legal tack only.

CLASS 6: Open (Approx. 80cm)No assistance other than calling the testDressage test:Prelim 3 (2024) – Whips allowed. BRC legal tack only.

CLASS 7: Open Plus (Approx. 85cm plus) No assistance other than calling the test Dressage test: Prelim 3 (2024) – Whips allowed. BRC legal tack only.

Ditches - Please note there are no ditches in any classes.

PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING FOR DRESSAGE - BITS & WHIPS

Classes 1, 2,3, 4 - the Dressage test may be ridden in **any normal riding bit** (such as a snaffle, gag, or pelham type with a straight bar, single joint or French link).

Grass reins are allowed for the dressage phases of class 1, 2 and 3, and for the jumping sections of classes 1 and 2.

Classes 5, 6, 7 the Dressage test must be ridden in a snaffle type bit (as per BRC Rulebook).

HUNTER TRIAL

Class 8: MINI (May be Assisted) Fences approx. 25-30 cm

Assistance including leading rein may be given WITHOUT penalty. Suitable for all ages. Water not included

Class 9: MINI PLUS Fences approx. 40cm Assistance may be given, although not suitable for lead rein. **Water in Class 2:** The water is optional. If you attempt the water and have any problems you will incur the relevant penalties.

Class 10: NOVICEFences approx. 50cm (No Assistance allowed)Eland Lodge Qualifier for 50cm ChampionshipSection A: Juniors (16 and Under on 1st January 2025).Section B: Seniors (Over 16 years)

Class 11: NOVICE PLUS Fences approx. 60cm (No Assistance allowed) Eland Lodge Qualifier for 50cm Championship Section A: Juniors (16 and Under on 1st January 2025). Section B: Seniors (Over 16 years)

Class 12: Mini PICK & MIX Fences approx. 40cm – 60cm (No Assistance allowed) Riders can select any height of jump that is included in the 40cm, 50cm, or 60cm courses.

Class 13: Mini PICK & MIX PAIRS Fences approx. 40cm – 60cm (No Assistance allowed) Riders can select any height of jump that is included in the 40cm, 50cm, or 60cm courses. In the Pairs class, each rider is marked separately, and will incur penalties accordingly.

Water in Class 12 & 13: The water can be missed as with the 40cm class. If you attempt the water and have any problems you will incur the relevant penalties.

Class 14: INTERMEDIATEFences approx. 70cm (No Assistance allowed)Eland Lodge Qualifier for 70cm ChampionshipSection A: Juniors (16 and Under on 1st January 2025).Section B: Seniors (Over 16 years)

Class 15: OPENFences approx. 80cm (No Assistance allowed)Eland Lodge Qualifier for 80cm ChampionshipSection A: Juniors (16 and Under on 1st January 2025).Section B: Seniors (Over 16 years)

Class 16: OPEN PAIRS Fences approx. 80cm (No Assistance allowed) Eland Lodge Qualifier for 80cm Pairs Championship

Class 17: OPEN PLUS Fences approx. 85cm (No Assistance allowed)
Eland Lodge Qualifier for the 90cm Championship
Section A: Juniors (16 and Under on 1st January 2025). Section B: Seniors (Over 16 years)
Class 18: Maxi PICK & MIX Fences approx. 70cm-90cm (No Assistance allowed)
Riders can select any height of jump that is included in the 70cm, 80cm, or 85cm Plus courses.

Class 19: Maxi PICK & MIX PAIRSFences approx. 70cm – 90cm (No Assistance allowed)Riders can select any height of jump that is included in the 70cm, 80 or 85cm Plus courses.

The Water in Classes 10-19 (Except classes 12 & 13): Fully included as part of the course and will incur penalties in line with all other fences.

Pick and Mix Classes:

Riders must attempt one jump from each line of fences where all height are together (for example, the first log or the railway crossing), they may choose to jump other jumps of the height they choose. The easiest way to select your pick and mix track is to choose a height you would like to jump, follow that course and jump larger fences on the easy fences or select a smaller option on a more daunting fence.

A and B Sections are solely for qualification purposes. Sections will be combined for placings.

All Hunter Trial classes will include a clearly marked fastest or optimum time section

Please see the information board and our Facebook page for information on which is being used – it will depend upon the ground conditions.

CLOSING DATE: The Wednesday before the competition. If classes are full before the closing date, then a waiting list will be held. Start Time: Class 1, approx. 9.00am

TIMES: Start lists with times will be on the My Riding Life website; by the evening of Friday before the competition.

PRIZEGIVING: Class presentations will take place immediately after each class. Rosettes: to sixth place in each class.

NUMBER BIBS: Number bib holders will be required to display the provided numbers. A small selection are available to hire at a cost of £5 hire plus £10 deposit per bib.

DISCLAIMERS

1. Save for the death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the organisers or anyone for whom they are in law responsible, neither the organisers of this event or British Riding Club nor any agent, employee, or representative of these bodies, nor the landlord or his tenant, accepts any liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, spectators, land , cars/ lorries/trailers, their contents and accessories or any other personal property whatsoever, whether caused by their negligence, breach of contract or in any way whatsoever. Entries are only accepted on this basis.

2. The organisers of this event have taken all reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present at this event. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents. They must obey the instructions of the organisers and all officials and stewards.

3. All non Riding Club competitors are not covered by British Riding Club's insurance and must have their own third party cover. The Tumpy Green Branch of British Riding Clubs and the organisers of this event are not legally responsible for non-Members and their insurance will not cover them.

RULES AND NOTICES

1. Substitutions allowed – please tell the Secretary (Entries before the day, Show on the day). All changes must be on the day once the times have been published.

2. Pre-entries are essential as entries will be limited. If you miss the closing date, please email the Entries Secretary for available spaces.

3. Closing date for entries – Wednesday before the competition. Withdrawal refunds given on receipt of a relevant doctor/vet certificate received by the Entries Secretary within a week of the competition (please enclose an s.a.e.)

4. If the show is cancelled due to circumstances beyond our control, entry fees will be help in credit for a future event. Any refund will be subject to an administration fee.

5. TIMES WILL BE GIVEN – please see the My Riding Life website. Competitors may be asked to jump up to 15 minutes before their given time – please be ready.

6. Warm-up Arena – the number of competitors may be restricted; please obey the steward's instructions as to when you can use the warm-up.

7. No one will be allowed to enter the warm-up arena without a number or until the First Aid and entry fees have been paid. Children must not ride in the warm-up arena without an accompanying adult.

8. Each combination may only compete once in any given class. Stallions are allowed only with prior permission from the Entries Secretary and must wear stallion discs and ribbons. All horse/ponies must be at least 4 years old on day of competition.

9. Turnout for ALL riders and horses should be as in the Riding Club Rules for Eventing 2025. Please contact the Entries Secretary BEFORE the show day for any queries re dress/turnout.

10. Any abuse of horses/ponies, officials, other competitors or members of the public will not be tolerated and those found doing so will be asked to leave the venue with no compensation and may be reported to the relevant authority.

11. Judges' decision is final. Any objection must be handed to the Show Secretary in writing with a £20 deposit (which will be forfeited if the objection is not upheld) within 15 minutes of the incident and BEFORE the prize-giving for that class.

12. INSURANCE; please ensure that you have adequate/appropriate insurance for rider, horse, property and third party.

13. PHOTOGRAPHS: by entering this competition you are agreeing to be photographed whilst competing; these photographs may be used for future publicity. If you do not wish to be photographed please tell the photographer on entering the arena, before you jump.

14. Participants attend at their own risk; neither the Committee nor Tumpy Green Competition Centre will be liable for any loss, damage or accident to horses, riders, property or other persons.

15. No horses/ponies should be left tied to the outside of trailers/lorries without supervision. Please clear any muck/rubbish and do not leave on the lorry park. Please be aware that there is no gate between the lorry park and the main road. All hay must be collected and removed from the lorry park.

16. The show will be run under The Riding Club Eventing and Hunter Trial Rules 2025.

17. Please abide by all signage and any Tumpy Green staff instructions – failure to do so could result in elimination and being asked to leave the event.

18. No hat or body cameras will be allowed to be worn on whilst mounted on the show grounds.
