Riders entering the under 12s classes are not eligible for classes 1,2,6,7,8,10,11,12,13,14 &15

- 1. RIDDEN BEST TURNED-OUT (Horse/pony and Rider)
- NOVICE RIDDEN (Horse/pony or Rider) Please enter in the spirit intended of inexperienced rider or horse (walk and trot only)
- 3. RIDDEN MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND
- 4. RIDDEN COB Traditional or Hogged
- 5. RIDDEN COLOURED Open to piebald, skewbald, palomino, dun and appaloosa.
- 6. RIDDEN HUNTER (Horse/pony)
- 7. RIDDEN SHOW PONY/HACK/RIDING HORSE
- 8. OPEN EQUITATION (Horse/pony, judged on rider ability)
- **9. RIDDEN VETERAN** Horse or pony, to exceed 15 years in age
- 10. BEST RIDING CLUB TYPE Horse/pony versatility across all riding club activities; includes a small jump

WORKING HUNTER CLASSES

Working Hunter Classes will be judged on jumping performance (50 marks), style and presence while jumping (20 marks), conformation, type and freedom of action(20 marks), manners (10 marks). All horses and ponies to be 4 years old and over.

- **11. 40** cm WORKING HUNTER Max. Height 40cm (Strictly beginners competitors entering class 11 cannot enter class 12, 13, 14, 15 or 29)
- 12. 60 cm WORKING HUNTER Max. Height 60cm (Aimed at Novice horse/pony or rider only)
- 13. 70 cm WORKING HUNTER Approx. Height 70cm
- 14. 80 cm WORKING HUNTER Approx. Height 80cm
- 15. 90 cm WORKING HUNTER Approx. Height 90cm

RING 3 – SHOWING CLASSES – Starts at 9:00 AM

- 16. IN-HAND TURN OUT AND CONDITION
- 17. IN-HAND YOUNGSTOCK Open to horses or ponies 3 years or under
- **18. BEST IN-HAND PONY** 14.2hh and under
- 19. BEST IN-HAND HORSE Over 14.2hh
- 20. IN-HAND MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND
- 21. IN-HAND COB Traditional or Hogged
- 22. IN-HAND COLOURED Open to piebald, skewbald, palomino, dun and appaloosa
- 23. IN-HAND VETERAN Horse or pony, to exceed 15 years in age
- **24. IN-HAND YOUNG HANDLER** (Handler under 12 years of age)

UNDER 12s - All classes open to Lead Rein and First Ridden

Riders entering the under 12s classes are not eligible for classes 1,2,6,7,8,10,11,12,13,14 &15

Start time not before 12 (to follow class 24) - Lead rein - riders must be 4 years old but not to have attained their 9th birthday. First ridden – riders not to have attained their 12th birthday as of 1st January. All lead reins must wear a snaffle, with the lead rein attached to the noseband. All first ridden ponies must wear a snaffle. No upper height limit for ponies. Balance reins ARE permitted.

- **25. UNDER 12s BEST TURNED-OUT** Pony, rider and leader
- 26. UNDER 12s EQUITATION Judged on rider ability
- 27. UNDER 12s HAVE A GO OFF THE LEAD Assistance may be given
- **28. UNDER 12s BEST RIDING CLUB TYPE Horse or pony** To include a small jump/trotting poles
- **29. UNDER 12s CRADLE STAKES WORKING HUNTER** Max. Height 30cm, Max. 5 jumps Assistance may be given

MAIN RING - SHOW JUMPING - 10.00 AM

HORSES AND PONIES WILL JUMP TOGETHER OVER A SINGLE-PHASE COURSE BUT WILL BE PLACED SEPERATELY.

PONY MUST BE 14.2HH OR UNDER - HORSE EXCEEDING 14.2HH
NO HORSE OR PONY TO ENTER MORE THAN 3 SHOW JUMPING CLASSES

- MAX. HEIGHT 50CM **30.** 50 CM SHOWJUMPING A) PONY B) HORSE (Strictly beginners - competitors entering class 30 cannot enter classes 32,33,34 or 35) 31. 60 CM SHOWJUMPING - MAX. TICKHILL RIDING CLUB RULES

- All entries are made on the basis that all individuals have read and will comply the club rules
- A valid passport and vaccination record must accompany the horse/pony to all events and be available for inspection
- Horses must be vaccinated in accordance with BRC rules https://www.bhs.org.uk/british-riding-clubs/brc-handbook/
- For all TRC events, all ages are as of the 01 January in the current year
- Riders can complete from 4 years old.
- All ridden horses must be 4 years and over
- Lead Rein competitors are not allowed in the main Show Jumping classes, and remain on the Lead Rein whilst on site
- Entry fees are only refundable prior to the withdrawal date (Wednesday prior to the show)
- TRC members will accrue points for a nominated horse/pony towards the annual awards
- Hats must be worn with harnesses properly adjusted and fastened: They MUST adhere to <u>BRC standards</u>
- Skull cap hats must be worn with a silk
- Body protectors encouraged for show jumping and working hunter classes
- The correct show jumping and showing attire must be worn, for more information see <u>TRC website</u>
- During periods of extreme weather, the committee will announce temporary rulings relating to the wearing of jackets and/or coats
- No Whips are not to exceed 75cm (30ins)
- Excessive us of whips or spurs will be challenged by the committee, using the opportunity to educate the individual on correct horsemanship
- Any complaint must be lodged at the Secretary's cabin with the payment of £10, which will be refunded should the objection not be sustained
- The decision of the judges or committee will be final
- The committee reserves the right to refuse an entry
- The committee reserve the right to refuse entry, amalgamate or cancel any class at their discretion and no correspondence will be entered into regarding the non-acceptance
- The committee reserves the right to change the identity of the judge for any classes from the one previously announced
- Any competitor not ready when called may be eliminated
- Foals are not permitted to attend the show. Stallions are only permitted to attend with prior agreement of the committee
- All dogs must be always kept on a lead
- PLEASE NOTE LUNGEING IS NOT ALLOWED ON THE SHOW FIELD
- All horses or ponies attending the club field must have adequate insurance cover (at least third party)
- Spectators are reminded that Horse and Ponies can be unpredictable and to always take care of themselves and their children. People behaving inappropriately will be advised, and if necessary asked to leave the showground
